

- -Adapt a well known story to write own version of We're Going on a Bear Hunt to We're going on a Bug Hunt.
- -Describe simple organisational features in fiction e.g. beginning, middle and end and similarities to other stories using the storu Leaf.
- -Spell common exception words (keywords starting with Butterfly and Teddy words)
- -Begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place. (i, l, t, h, n, m, w, u, y, r, p, j, k, b)
- -Demarcate sentences using a full stop.
- -Demarcate sentences using a capital letter.
- -Join words using 'and'
- -Write a sequence of linked sentences.
- -Re-read and edit writing to check it makes sense.
