Reports

End of year reports will be with you week beginning July 12th. There will be no face to face meetings to discuss the reports due to lockdown extension. There will be no national benchmarks, however the class teacher will identify for parents the key learning in English and Maths so you are aware of their progress against the expectations for the year group.
