Parent Code of Conduct

We have a Parent Code of Conduct to ensure that all parents abide by the same values that we expect from the staff and children. The following behaviours are not tolerated:

- Disruptive or threatening behaviour
- Rude, loud, aggressive language or swearing
- Openly disrespectful or offensive comments
- Physical aggression
- Recording conversations using a device
- Approaching other people's children without consent

It is also important to stress that these rules apply to telephone conversations with staff and social media posts. Therefore breach of the Code of Conduct and subsequent actions taken will also be strictly applied if comments are made on any online platform.

Year 6 Practice SATs

Well done to pupils in Year 6 who completed their practice SATs this week. Next Friday Miss Millar and Miss Smith will be sending home their scores and giving you the chance to discuss them if you wish.

Hot Lunches

We have looked into the possibility of once again providing hot lunches for the children. As with all changes to current routines, we undertake a careful risk assessment to look at the safety and potential risks. At the current time, it is not possible to provide hot lunches based on safety. We have up to 200 hot lunches in normal times and getting this number of meals served to children in 15 different bubbles is not possible. We will update you as soon as the situation changes.

We will be able to offer a Christmas packed-lunch – details to follow.

Water bottles

Please can you remember to send children in with water bottles every day.

Guidance on Symptoms

If your child develops any symptoms of Covid-19, he/she and any siblings must not come into school for 10 days from the first day of the symptoms.

Symptoms are:

High temperature; New/Continuous Cough; Loss of Smell or Taste

You must arrange for your child to be **tested** as soon as possible.

If your child receives a **negative test**, he/she and any siblings may return to school.

If your child receives a **positive test**, he/she and any siblings should remain off school for 14 days from **the date** of the positive test and school must be notified.

If it is known that your child has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, your child must isolate for 14 days, even if they have no symptoms.

On the last day of term (18th December) we finish early. This will be staggered in line with the current finish times, so all classes will finish 2 hours before their usual time:
