### **Covid Update**

I wrote to you on Tuesday regarding the number of Covid cases in school. Thankfully for most children Covid is fairly mild and this week many children have returned to school following their self-isolation.

As you know, when 3 or more children in a class test positive for Covid, we take extra measures to stop the spread of the virus including the children being in a class 'bubble'.

**Public Health England** have been in touch with us regularly to risk assess our measures. This week they commended us on our effective response to the Covid cases in school. I would like to thank the staff for this, especially when many adults were off. I would also like to thank parents for keeping children off when they are unwell, and for testing regularly to identify Covid.

### Please remember:

- Children should not come to school if they are unwell, even if their illness seems mild.
- Children must self-isolate for at least 5 clear days when testing positive and only return after 2 negative tests (and no temperature).
- Children must take a PCR test if the have a continuous cough, high-temperature or loss of taste/smell.
- Children should do daily LFTs when other members of the household test positive.
- It is also recommended that all children take regular tests before coming into school.

We are also lucky to have a great pastoral team which many children work with throughout the year. This includes our ELSA (Mrs Clark), our Well-being Support (Mrs Gamble) and our Family Support Worker (Mrs Pelling) who works primarily with parents. We also have two counsellors who visit school each week – Charlie and Jane – for 1:1 sessions.

If ever you feel your child has a worry, whether it is from in school or out of school, we can point them in the right direction to help give the support they need.

Please remember, for **Safeguarding** concerns, our Designated Lead is **Mrs Johnson** and our Deputy Leads are **Mr Williams** and **Mrs Udale.**
