Home Reading

Thank you to everyone who reads regularly at home with their children. With three young children myself, I know what a challenge this can be, especially when children are tired, you are busy or they are reticent to read! However, reading with you child is one of the most important things that you can do to help your child in all areas of the primary curriculum and Early Years.

There are two types of home reading – the first is where your child reads to you and this should be with a school book as this will have been chosen to match the phonic phase or general reading ability of your child. When children reach a certain level in Key Stage 2, this can be a 'free reading' book, but it is still important that they read it to an adult.

The second type is reading for enjoyment. This should always be a book that the child enjoys. Usually, this type of reading would involve you reading it to your child, your child reading to you, or the child reading it to themselves or just looking at pictures.

Both types of reading are important for developing children's reading skills and a love of books! Mr Williams.

Thursday 1st April – Final Day of Term – early finish: Please note, this will be staggered so each class will finish 2 hours before their usual time (e.g. if your child normally finishes as 2.55pm, they will finish at 12.55pm).

Guidance on Covid-19 Symptoms.

If your child develops any symptoms of Covid-19, he/she and any siblings must not come into school for 10 days from the first day of the symptoms.

Symptoms are: High temperature; New/Continuous Cough; Loss of Smell or Taste

You must arrange for your child to be **tested** as soon as possible. If your child receives a **negative test**, he/she and any siblings may return to school.

If your child receives a **positive test**, he/she and any siblings should remain off school for 10 days from **the date of the positive test and** <u>school must be notified</u>.

If it is known that your child has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, your child must isolate for 10 days, even if they have no symptoms.

Start and Finish Times:

You must be on time. If you are late, you will be asked to wait until all other classes have entered/exited school. If you have more than 1 child, please stand well clear of the coned area whilst waiting.
