SATs

National tests for Year 6 pupils (SATs) take place in the week commencing **9**th **May**. It is important that all pupils attend school all week unless we have agreed an authorised absence. For any child missing a test due to illness, we have to submit an application for the test to be carried out on a different day. Further information will be sent out next week.

Year 6 SATs are done under test conditions and all papers are sent away to be marked externally. The children are well-prepared and have had practice recently, so we try hard to not put any undue pressure on the children. Year 2 SATs are less formal and while it is important that the children do their best, we explain that the tests are 'jobs' to check how they are progressing. Year 2 SATs are marked by the teachers.

Year 4 Nepal Theme

Year 4 are currently studying mountains, with a focus on Nepal and the Himalayas. Mr Fry and Mrs Shaw are hoping to invite some Nepalese visitors into school to tell us more about their home country and answer some of the children's questions. Covid Update

The new advice from Public Health England (from 1st April) says:

- Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and not attend school, avoiding contact with other people.
- If a child has a positive COVID-19 test result they should stay at home and not attend school for 3 days after the test.
- Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education or childcare setting.
