School Improvement Aims

Each new school year we think carefully about our main aims to improve our school. This year these are our 4 aims:

1. To improve progress for boys. Across the country, girls achieve better than boys at primary school so our aim is for all pupils to do equally well.

2. To improve progress for children with special educational needs. We want all children, including those with special needs to be supported well to make good progress.

3. To assess children's work effectively. We want to understand children's progress even better so we can plan future learning and support.

4. To engage parents with children's learning. We want all parents to understand their child's learning and how they can best support them at home.

New Routines

Thank you for helping the drop-off and pick-up routines to run smoothly. A reminder that school starts at **8.40am** and finishes at **3.00pm** (lower school) and **3.10pm** (upper school). Lower school parents may walk children round to the classroom in the morning but please let upper school children (Years 3-6) walk round independently. **No parents may enter the school building**, the only exception being the school office, and this needs to be restricted to one parent/family at a time.

Most pupils in Years 3-6 walk to the gate or home at the end of the day. Please give permission via the school office if you are happy for your child to do this. <u>Without</u> <u>permission, children are not allowed to leave the</u> <u>classroom.</u>
