#### Safeguarding – Our Safeguarding Team

In school, we teach children that all members of staff can be viewed as 'trusted adults'. This means that children know they can talk to adults about a worry. Children have a 'safeguarding hand' where they write down the names of adults and children who they most trust to share a worry with.

All children have small worries and usually we can help with these by talking to the child. If an adult thinks a worry is more significant, staff are trained in how to record this and pass it on to a member of the school Safeguarding Team – Mrs Johnson, Mr Williams and Mrs Udale. We then work together to help the child, speaking to parents when required. Our brilliant pastoral team also often help with children's worries – Mrs Pelling (Family Support), Mrs Clark (ELSA) and Mrs Gamble (Well-Being Support).

#### **Covid Update**

The new advice from Public Health England (from 1<sup>st</sup> April) says:

- Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and not attend school, avoiding contact with other people.
- If a child has a positive COVID-19 test result they should stay at home and not attend school for 3 days after the test.

Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education or childcare setting
