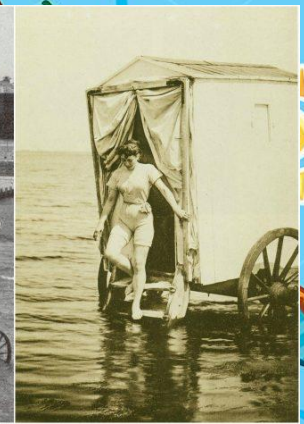
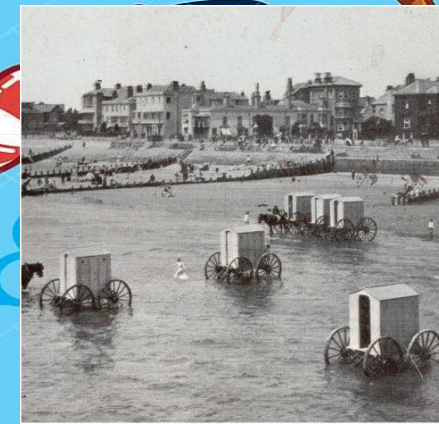
## Key Knowledge

Holidays in the past were health related. The Victorians believed that the seaside air and sea water was good for your health.

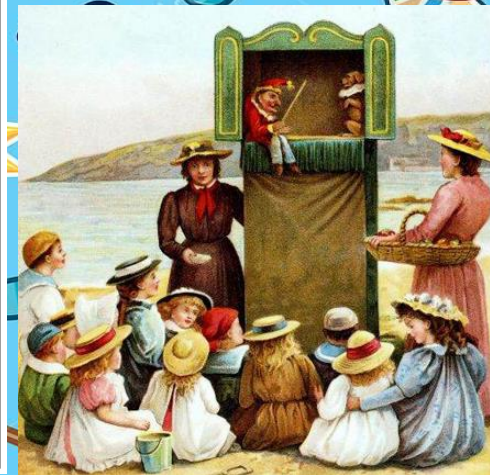

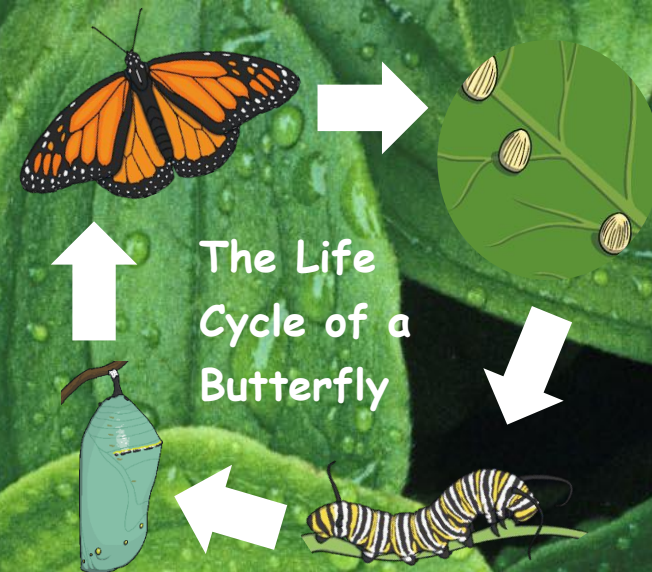
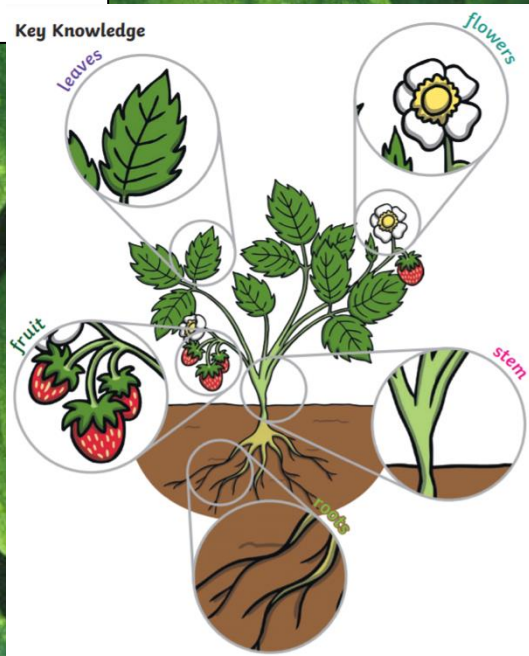

### Plants

#### Key Vocabulary

<b>wild plants</b>	A <b>wild plant seed</b> grows where it falls. It doesn't need to be planted or cared for as it grows.
<b>garden plants</b>	<b>Garden plants</b> are plants that people choose to grow in their gardens.
<b>weed</b>	<b>Weeds</b> are <b>wild plants</b> that grow in places where people don't want them.
<b>deciduous</b>	A <b>deciduous</b> tree loses its <b>leaves</b> each year.
<b>evergreen</b>	An <b>evergreen</b> tree keeps its green <b>leaves</b> all year round, even in the winter.
<b>life processes</b>	These are the things that all <b>living</b> things do. They move, breathe, sense, grow, make babies, get rid of waste and get their energy from food.
<b>living</b>	Things that are <b>living</b> have all the <b>life processes</b> .
<b>dead</b>	Things that are <b>dead</b> were once <b>living</b> . They did have all the <b>life processes</b> but don't now.
<b>never living</b>	Things made out of metal, plastic or rock were <b>never living</b> . They never had the <b>life processes</b> .
<b>food chain</b>	A <b>food chain</b> shows how each animal gets its food. <b>Food chains</b> are one of the ways that <b>living</b> things <b>depend</b> on each other to stay alive.

**Herbivore** - animals that only eat plants, seeds or nuts

**Omnivore** - animals that eat both plants and animals

**Carnivore** - animals that only eat animals

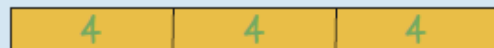
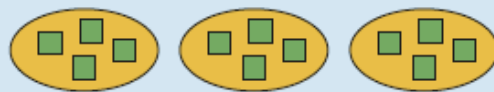
Life cycle	A series of stages a living thing goes through during its life.
